Freedom of Thought and Expression in Iran: A Comparative ...

Freedom of thought, conscience and religion is absolute under Article 18. However, the freedom to manifest a religion or a thought and the freedom of expression is not absolute and is limited to two criteria: 1 rights and reputations of others, 2 protection of national security and public order.
